

BLOOD SERVICES

Ensuring Unhindered Access to Safe Blood

During the lockdown period, Red Cross staff & volunteers have been engaged in providing blood services, holding blood donation camps, motivating & mobilizing donors, free pick up and drop facilities & supporting Govt. Hospitals with blood supply.

79,000+ units of blood has been collected through Red Cross' support.





1,775+ Blood Donation Camps have been held.

People dying of COVID require specialized cover & handling. IRCS NHQ has facilitated 360 dead body management cases.

SHELTER & MEALS

Besides, **1,274 Quarantine Centers** have supported **41,760** people.

SUPPORTING MEDICAL NEEDS



61,570 beneficiaries (mainly Thalassemia, cancer & dialysis) have benefited through transportation services provided by **388 Red Cross vehicles** during the lockdown period.

Free medicines worth Rs. 44 lakh+ have also been provided to the needy, including several TB &

BUILDING IMMUNITY



4 lakh+ pouches & bottles of Immunity boosting Homeopathic pills and Ayurvedic Kada provided free of cost to Red Cross staff, volunteers as well as vulnerable groups, including senior citizens.

1 lakh+ nutritional supplements have been distributed.

TRAININGS & PPE



The safety of our staff & volunteers is our priority.

4,500+ volunteers were trained in COVID 19 special trainings.

PPE items utilized are:

4,80,000+ Masks, **11,000**+ N95 Masks, **45,000**+ Sanitizers (500 ml), **85,000**+ Pairs of Gloves & **12,000**+ Single Use Gowns.

DOORSTEP DELIVERY OF ESSENTIALS

2,76,000+ vulnerable sections such as senior citizens, women headed households and needy in Red/Containment Zones have been reached at their doorstep with essential commodities such as food supply & medicines.



REUNITING FAMILIES

869 stranded individuals were connected & subsequently reunited with their families during the lockdown period under our Family News Service Program.

Dealing with Multiple Crisis

Assam Floods: Incessant rains have triggered floods in several parts of Assam, compounding the existing COVID19 crisis. Volunteers are doing all they can to support those affected. Preliminary assessment has been conducted. Essential items such as tarpaulins, drinking



water, food, etc. have been distributed. Besides, tarpaulin sheds have been installed alongside roads to provide temporary shelter to **32 families in Dhemaji** & **10 in Goalpara.**



Amphan Cyclone: Volunteers in West Bengal & Odisha are working tirelessly to support Amphan affected communities. Volunteers are extending their support in providing a cover to the roofless. Nearly 8500 tarpaulins & other relief aid is

being distributed among the needy.

Vizag Gas Leak tragedy:

For two days, IRCS Andhra Pradesh distributed over **3000 food packets** among evacuated families.




HON'BLE HFMs VISIT TO IRCS NHQ
