volunteers in Nellore, Andhra
Pradesh are running 5 Shelter
Homes for 800+ street dwellers &
migrant labourers stranded in the
State. The beneficiaries are being
provided food and medical care.

Red Crossers in J & K have come to the aid of a lady in need of regular dialysis. Post lockdown, daily wage earners have been facing difficulty in making ends meet. Thus, for the running month, IRCS J & K UT Branch has decided to support her in undergoing dialysis



Post lockdown, Red Cross
volunteers in Haryana have
reached 40,15,071 individuals with
dry ration & packed food. 53,386
stranded & migrant labourers are
being provided shelter in homes
set up by volunteers in districts
across the State. Provisions are
being made to sustain the ongoing
support



In Puducherry, volunteers are engaged in surveillance activities and are also reaching vulnerable communities with essential relief aid. They are inspecting vehicles & identifying suspect cases using thermal scanners at check posts, & are also distributing food, masks and home made sanitizers among the needy



Volunteers in **Tripura** are visiting remote **rural** areas to conduct **awareness** campaigns on covid19. They are engaging with communities to **answer** their **queries**, & fight **rumours** with **factual information** on prevention & spread of the disease



Volunteers in Uttarakhand are reaching people in remote, difficult terrains to ensure supply of essential foof items



Volunteers in Gumla, Jharkhanda are educating rural communities on covid19 & are distributing masks and ration among them

Fruits, water being provided to volunteers & Government staff providing services










IRCS' Focus









- Community Surveillance to enforce lockdown and social distancing in public places
- Home delivery of essential items such as food, ration, medicines for women headed households, senior citizens, disabled individuals
- Logistic support in running and monitoring quarantine & isolation centers and homes of suspect cases
- Several Red Cross hospitals & cyclone shelters are being converted into Isolation centres for suspect cases
- Where possible, available spaces are being converted into **Shelter Homes** for the needy
- Pilgrims, tourists, migrant labourers, students & others are being provided food & shelter & are being connected with their families

Red Cross owned vehicles have been made available to the local administration for use

Out of the total 89 Red Cross blood banks, many are being run 24/7. All efforts are being made to meet the needs of Thalassemic & other blood transfusion dependent patients. Pick and drop facility is being provided to donors wherever possible.

All precautions are being taken to ensure safety of staff, blood donors and patient attendants.
