Nearly 150 persons donate blood at IPM

Hyderabad: Everyday 20 to 30 persons are donating blood at IPM, Narayanaguda after health department had decided to collect blood to meet requirements of state hospitals where blood banks are not functioning since lockdown. Cyberabad CP VC Sajjanar and cops and members of Cyberabad Security Council visited IPM on Sunday and donated blood which is sure to inspire others to voluntarily come forward in the coming days. IPM Director Dr K Shankar stated that donors, who are contacting their office, are being told to download an app on their phones and give their consent after which a text message about the slot and time would be sent to a donor's phone. It may be mentioned here that in view of the covid-19 lockdown and scarcity of blood as no voluntary blood donation camps are being held for at least two weeks, the Telangana government has decided to collect blood at stand alone blood centers at IPM, Narayanaguda. The government has appealed to donors to contact Hyderabad DMHO office (84979 58597, 04 29569047). Telangana state has nearly 1625 patients suffering from Thalassemia disease. Doorstep blood collection to tide over scarcity in Koraput

WITH voluntary blood donors unable to step out of their houses due to the lockdown, a group of volunteers have begun using a mobile blood collection van to reach out to them. The sole mobile blood collection van in the district, attached to Sree Laxman Nayak Medical College and Hospital (MCH), was inaugurated by Health Minister Naba Kishore Dash in October 2019 but had been lying unused for the last three months. After the Coronavirus outbreak, members of the District Blood Donors and Motivators Forum approached the MCH and local administration to let them run the van to collect blood from donors at their doorsteps.

Volunteers swell ranks of Red Cross warriors fighting Covid-19 battle

Guntur: For volunteers at Red Cross, a typical day during this lockdown begins at 4am. They distribute food to the destitute, deliver essential commodities, medicines to the aged and masks and sanitizers to frontline warriors. They are relentlessly working to help people stay at home and stay safe.

While the volunteers are sweating it out in the scorching heat, the organisation heads of Red Cross Guntur unit are spending sleepless nights to keep the stocks ready by dawn. Among them are billionaire Industrialist Penmatsa Ramachandra Raju, who is playing the role of the chairman of the

to leave after completing relief operations. Attending to dozens of calls from people in need, including doctors and nurses, deputing his armies to the field and prevailing upon philanthropists to do their bit make up Raju's daily schedule. Other such persons are international director of Rotary

GYN Babu and advisor SVS Lakshminarayana who are using their resources to mobilise donations and stocks to help the needy in the crisis time. "I am proud of my volunteers who are relentlessly working without taking a penny from the organisation," said Raju. Around 100-120 volunteers have joined the Red Cross WhatsApp group. They take down instructions from Raju to move to different locations. While some of them collect items such as masks, sanitizers, food packets and fruits from the office, a few others go to markets and ratha bazars ensure that people queue up and follow social distancing.
